

## **Darleen Hoover – Diploma 1952 Bismarck Hospital School of Nursing**

BISMARCK - Darleen Hoover, 90, of Bismarck, died on December 8, 2022, at Baptist Health & Rehab. She passed away peacefully with close friends and family at her side.

Born on January 6, 1932 in Salem, OR, Darleen was the youngest child of Rev. Gustav & Linda (Schaller) Rutsch. As a ministry family they relocated several times, including a brief stop in Alberta, Canada, before moving to Emery, South Dakota while Darleen was a young teen. She came to Bismarck to finish high school (BHS class of '49), and graduated from the Bismarck Hospital School of Nursing in 1952. Darleen resided in Bismarck for most of her adult life. As a registered nurse she served her community at the Bismarck Hospital (later Medcenter One), the last fourteen years as Infection Control Director (affectionately known as the 'bug lady'). She retired in 1992. She was a committed follower of Jesus Christ and a fixture at Bismarck Baptist Church, where she shared her passion for music as a vocalist, organist, and pianist for more than 50 years. She will be remembered for her musical skill, quick wit, love of her kids and grandkids, and a ceaseless capacity for debate.

Darleen is survived by her sons Bryan (Holly) Hochhalter of Bismarck, and Greg (Corrine) Hochhalter, of Sherwood Park, AB; 9 grandchildren (Adam, Amber, Alan, Alyssa, Tyler, Eric, David, Andrew, Karis); 6 great-grandchildren (Holiday, Halo, Cameron; Xavier, Emma, Torunn); 4 step-children (Kathy, Kenneth, Laurie, Daniel) and numerous step grandchildren and step great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her parents, her siblings Erna and Alvin, husband Milton Hochhalter, husband Elmer Hoover, son Ross, and daughter Lynnette Macdonald.
