



I-94 Arrival/Departure Record Retrieval

Upon your arrival to the United States, a U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CRP) officer stamps your travel document (usually your passport) with your admission date, the class of admission, and the date that you are admitted until. For F-1 and J-1 students and dependents, this date will show as "D/S" or Duration of Status. As you enter, an electronic record of your arrival to the United States was generated by CRP. This electronic record is called the "I-94 Arrival/Departure Record" and is most commonly referred to simply as the "I-94." Fleuse note increase that paper I-94 cords are still issued at local hunder parts of entry.

Question	Answer
Why do I need to make a copy? How do I retrieve my 1-94 admission number?	The electronic I-94 number proves your legal entry to the United States. It is assigned to each traveler to document arrival and departure from the U.S. • Keep a copy for yourself • Be sure to provide another copy to the International Student and Study Abroad Services (ISSAS) office along copies of your other travel documents such as copy of your entry stamp and visa in your passport. • Also retrieve copies of the I-94 numbers for each of your dependent family members After entering the U.S., you must go online and retrieve your E4 number and print it out—leeping for your permanent records. You must do this EACH TIME YOU TRAVEL. • To retrieve your I-94, go to warm chosen /194.
What information must I provide?	 Last/Surname (Family Name) and First (Given) name - As it appears on the travel document used to enter the United States. Birth date - Enter the date of your birth in the MM/DD/YYYY format Passport Number - If passport number is more than 10 characters, enter only the last 10 characters. Country of Issuance - Country of citizenship as found on your passport. Most Recent Date of Entry - Can be found on admission stamp located on your passport Class of Admission - Can be found on admission stamp located in your passport (F or J status, for example)
What benefits are provided through the 1-94?	An electronic I-94 number is required for immigration benefits that you may file for in the future, such as the following: Oriver's license application/renewal Work Authorization CPT or OPT for F-1 students or academic training for I-1si, on-campus work including student worker positions and assistantships, etc. Completing the I-9 Form when applying for jobs Social Security Number applications H-18 applications new applications and extensions Mumerous other immigration related benefits including change of status and permanent residency.
How long will my admission record be available on the I-94 website?	You will have access to the I-94 information until your next departure (at that point, your last entry record will become part of your travel history record). Be sure to retrieve it soon after each entry to the United States so that you can have records of all of your entries to the United States.
Mat #1 have an error on my 1-34 record?	Places first current with year interestional student whites for more information if you find an error. In general, if you were admitted incorrectly to the U.S., pas should visit a local CEP Deferred inspection Site or part of entry to have your admission corrected. A first of Deferred inspection Sites and parts of entry can be found at www.chp.gov , under the "Parts" link at the instance of the page. If you received an incorrect I-94 from U.S. Citizenship and brondynation Services, you should refer to Form I-102 evolution at wave variety gov/forces.


Immigration Documents
