82% increased their confidence as a leader (N=225)

87% gained personal benefits by volunteering, including developing new skills useful in other settings (N=225)

ND 4-H volunteers give **7** hours per month to their communities. Annually, this time is worth **\$2,165** per volunteer. With 1,540 volunteers in 2023, that's \$3.3 million.
