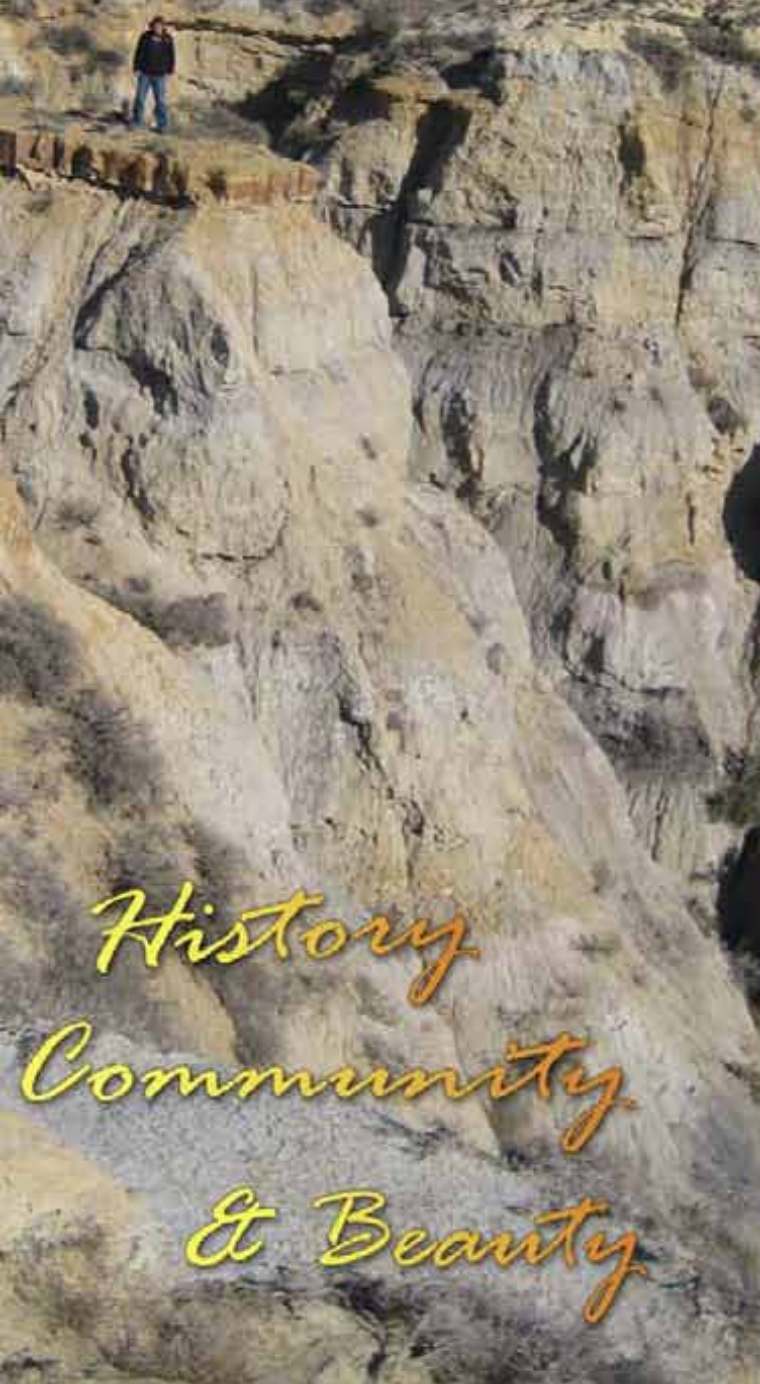

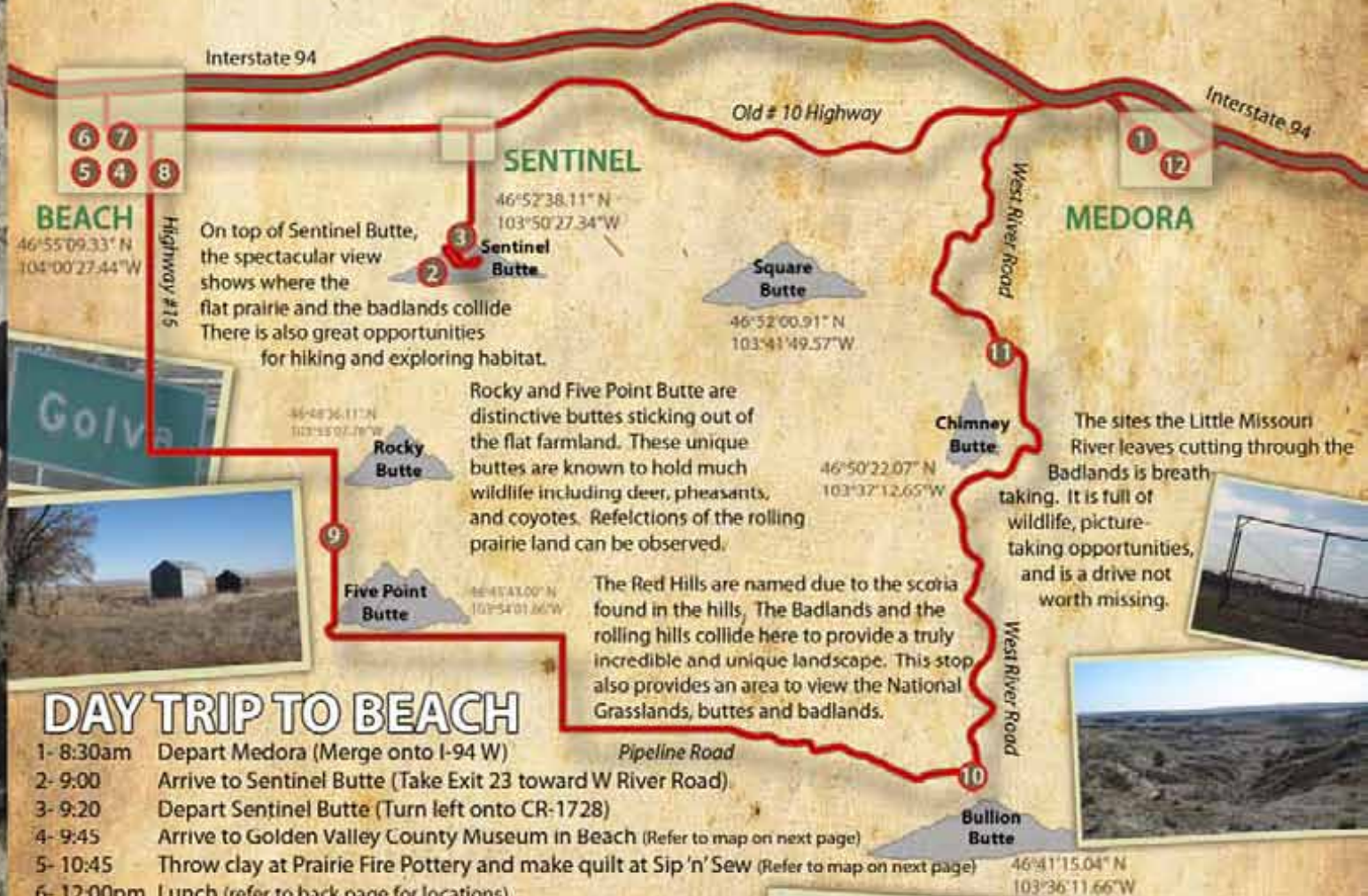

DAY TRIP TO BEACH

- 1- 8:30am Depart Medora (Merge onto I-94 W)
- 2- 9:00 Arrive to Sentinel Butte (Take Exit 23 toward W River Road)
- 3- 9:20 Depart Sentinel Butte (Turn left onto CR-1728)
- 4- 9:45 Arrive to Golden Valley County Museum in Beach (Refer to map on next page)
- 5- 10:45 Throw clay at Prairie Fire Pottery and make quilt at Sip 'n Sew (Refer to map on next page)
- 6- 12:00pm Lunch (refer to back page for locations)
- 7- 1:00 Explore Beach's Unique Market (Refer to map on next page)
- 8- 2:15 Depart Beach (Turn right on Highway 16)
- 9- 2:35 View of 5-Point and Rocky Butte (Turn left on 43rd St SW; Turn right on 164th Ave SW)
- 10- 3:00 Arrive at Red Hills and Bullion Butte (Turn left on Pipeline Road)
- 11- 3:40 View of Chimney and Square Butte (Pipeline Road merges into West River Road)
- 12- 4:45 Arrive to Medora (Follow West River Road Exit onto I-94 E to Medora)

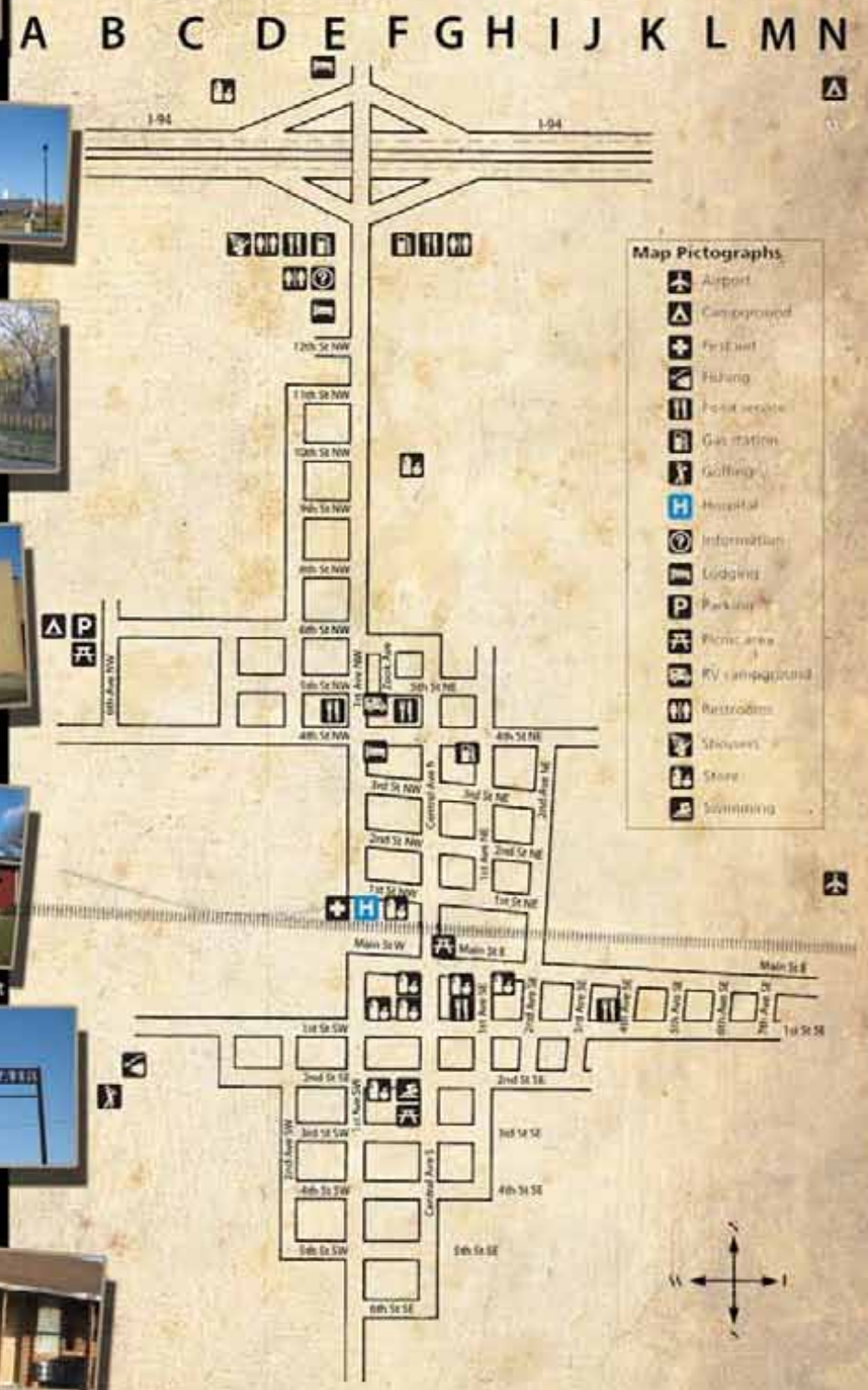

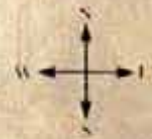

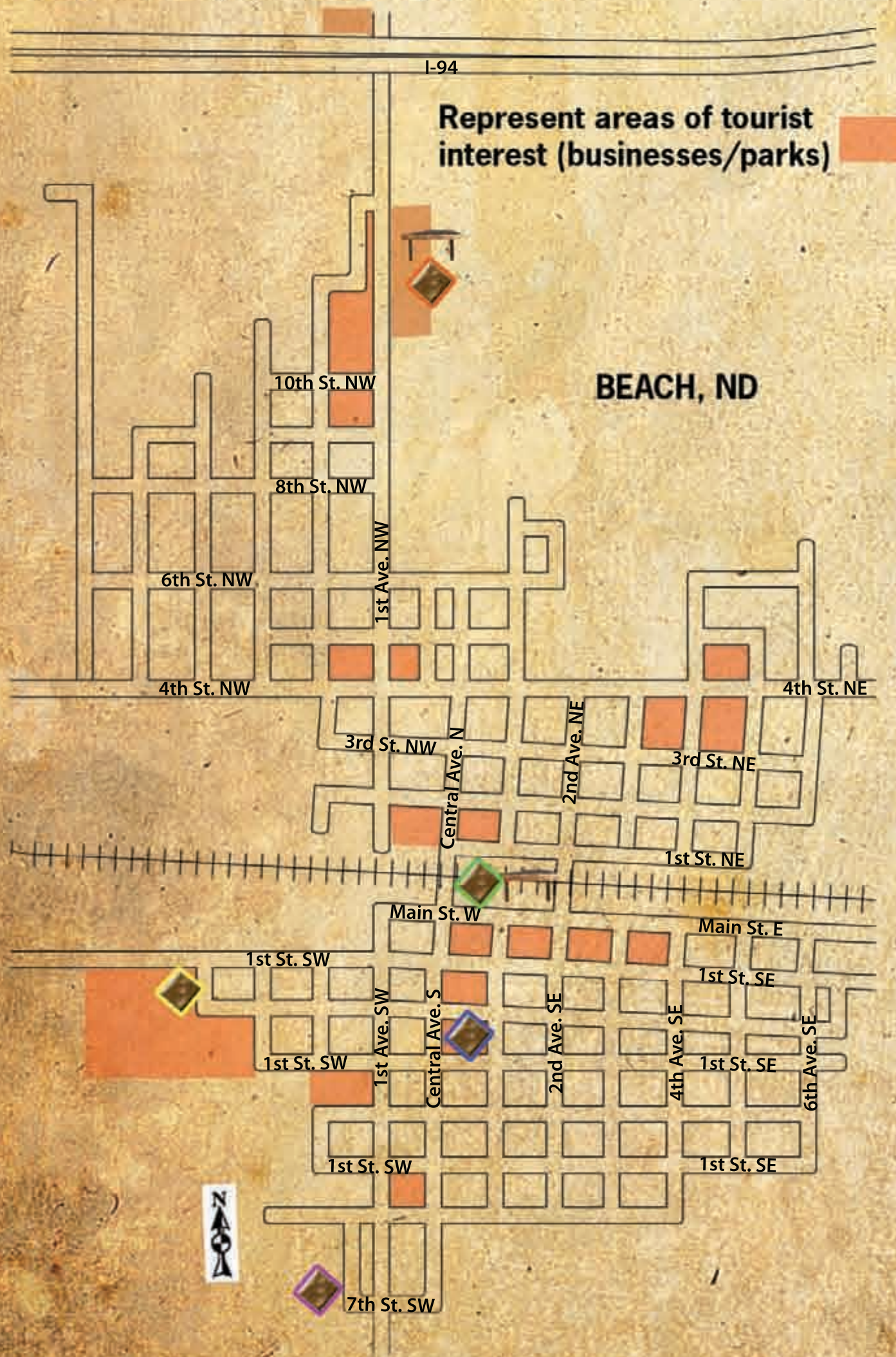

The designs interwoven into the Beach area take a three step approach in bringing tourism into Beach. The first is to entice travelers from the interstate to go downtown. The second is to introduce a train system from Medora to downtown Beach. Lastly, is to provide guidance to the unique landscapes around Beach. With these three approaches people will have activities to spend a day trip in Beach.



The current RV park is small, and is not in proximity of any stores. With the relocation of the RV park, hunters and their families will now be closer to stores, restaurants, and bars. Also the cleanup of this area will help one of the major eye sores in Beach.

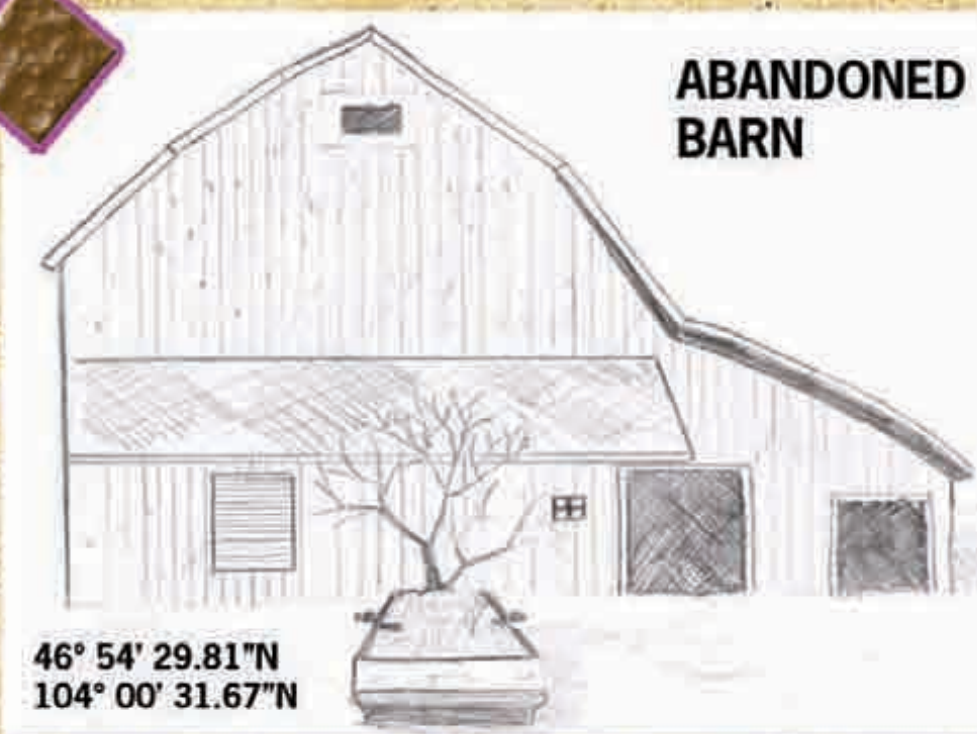


SCORIA ROAD MARKS

Another design implemented into Beach will be the use of scoria as a road material and dyed concrete sections into the sidewalk the color of scoria. The theme will act as a trail for pedestrian and vehicular traffic to identify where the sites, shops, and restaurants are. The scoria will be an underlying theme in the park, around town, and areas outside of Beach.



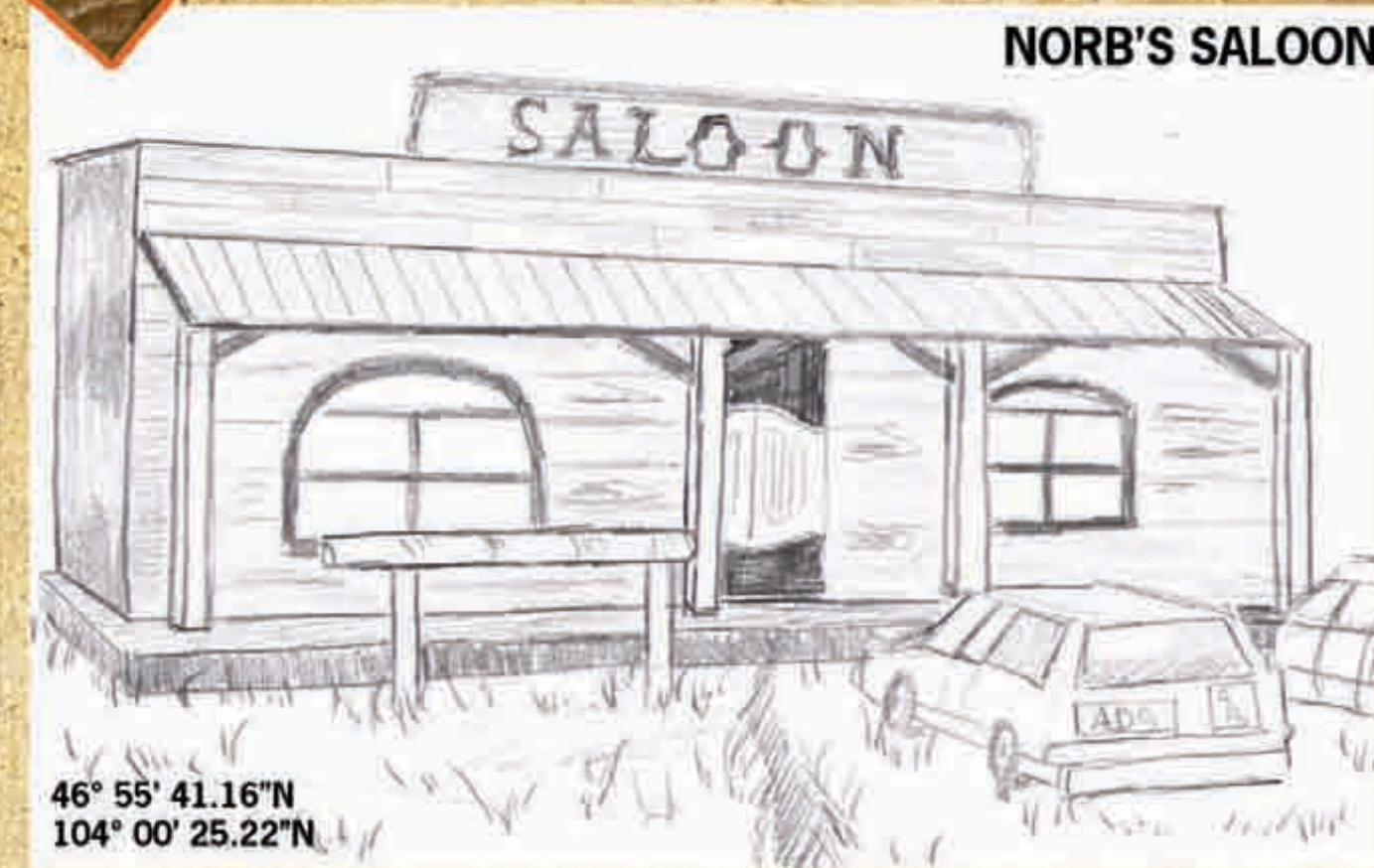
The first major design implemented will be four buildings abandoned in appearance will be placed around town. Each building will have a unique story and theme about the history of the area. The stories will be from locals and can be read on the walls in each building. Also in front of the building will be an old car with a unique feature to identify the abandoned building. Each building will also be located with coordinates for GPS to find.

FRED'S HOME

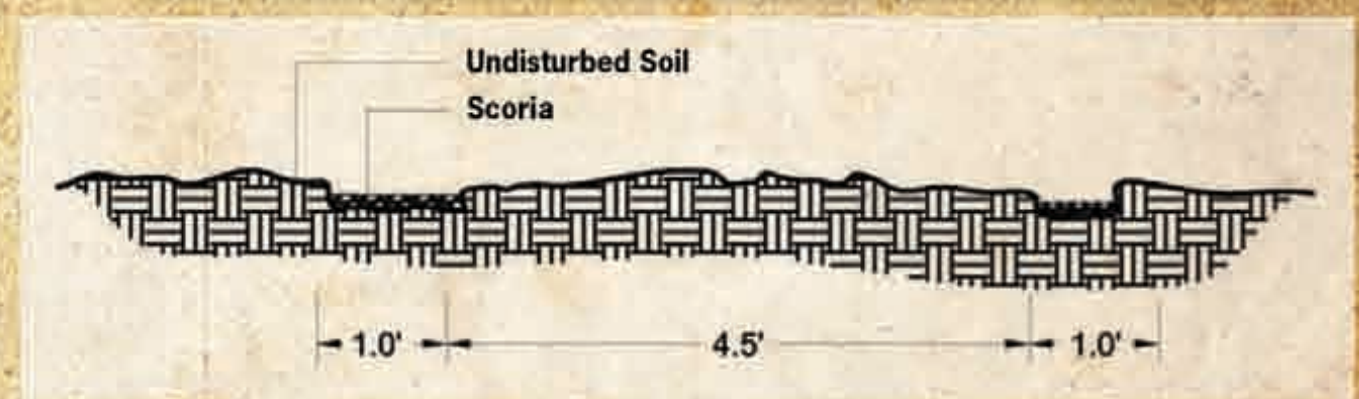

TRAIN DROP-OFF

Once off the train scoria paths will lead up to the kiosk in the local town park made of corrugated steel. The kiosk will be similar in appearance to an old farm yard surrounded by the rustic prairie grasses. The trail will then continue to the stores and the RV park.

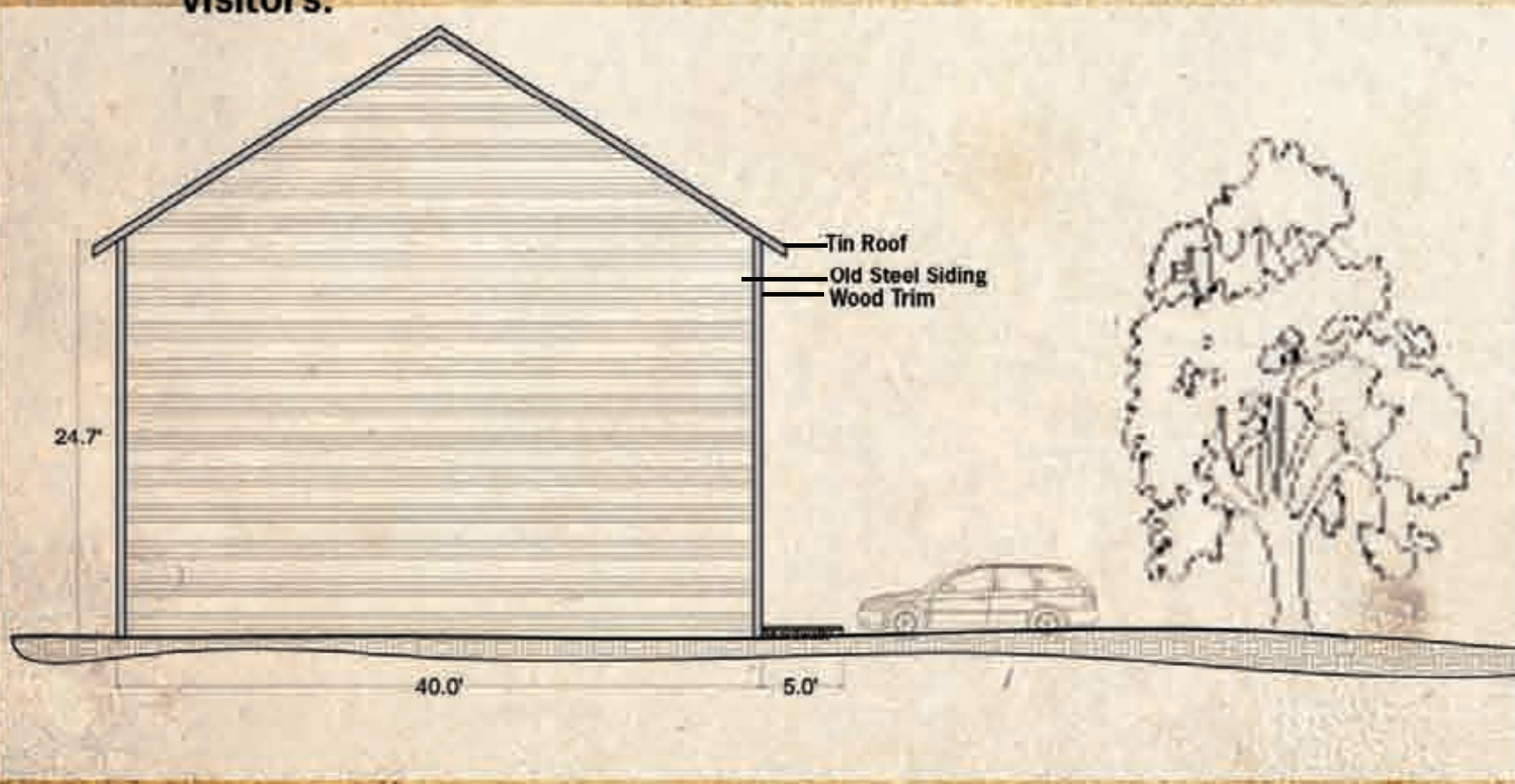


2 DOWNTOWN ALLEY PATH

A two track scoria road from the information kiosk will guide people to the RV park, other unique shops, and restaurants. Also now people staying in the RV park will be able to have quick access to the downtown of Beach. This will provide for more people to be in the heart of Beach.

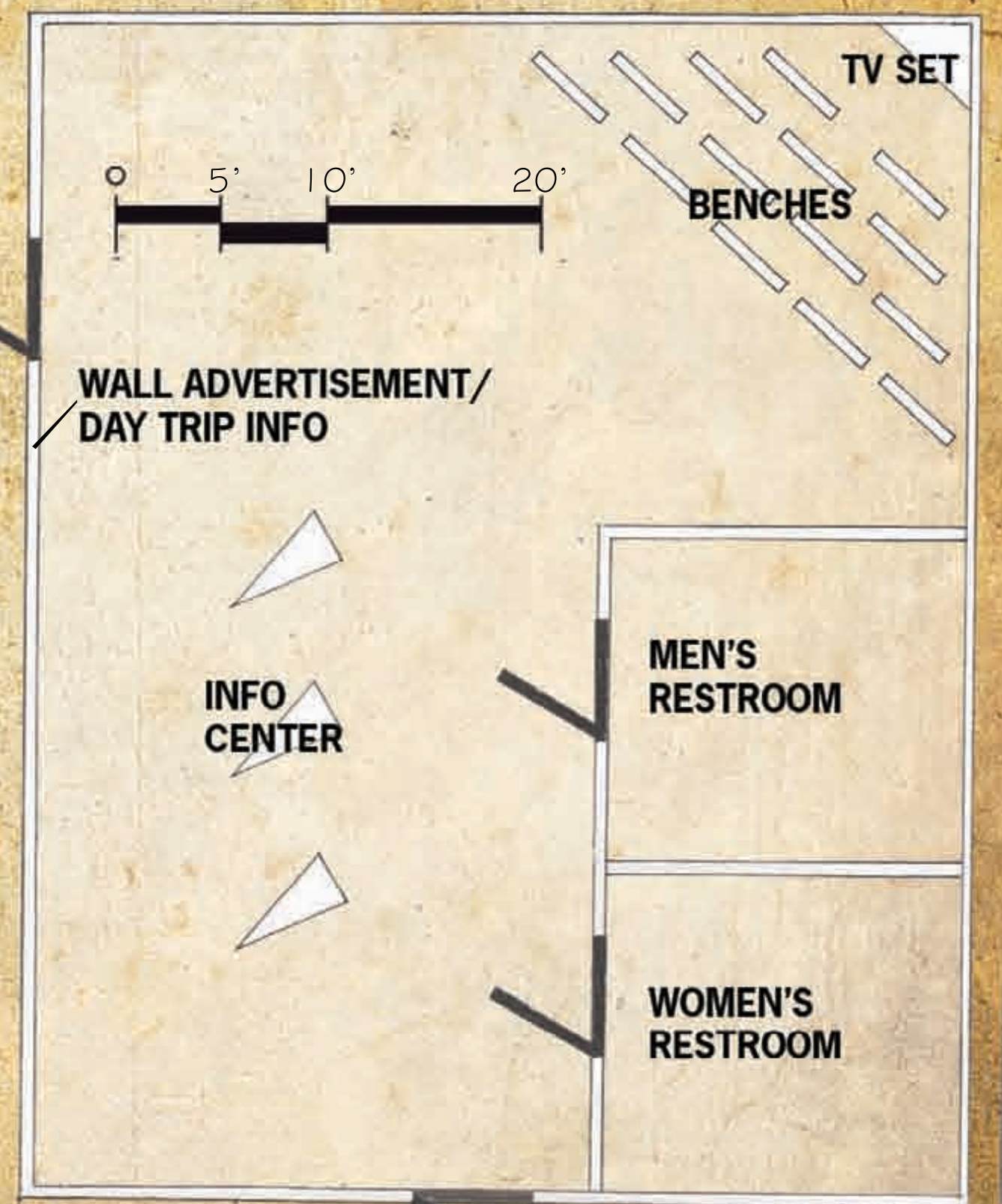


The second design concept is bringing a train from Medora for a half day trip to visit the stores. The train will deliver people almost directly to the stores. On arrival one of the four abandoned buildings (shown below) will serve as a kiosk and waiting area for visitors.



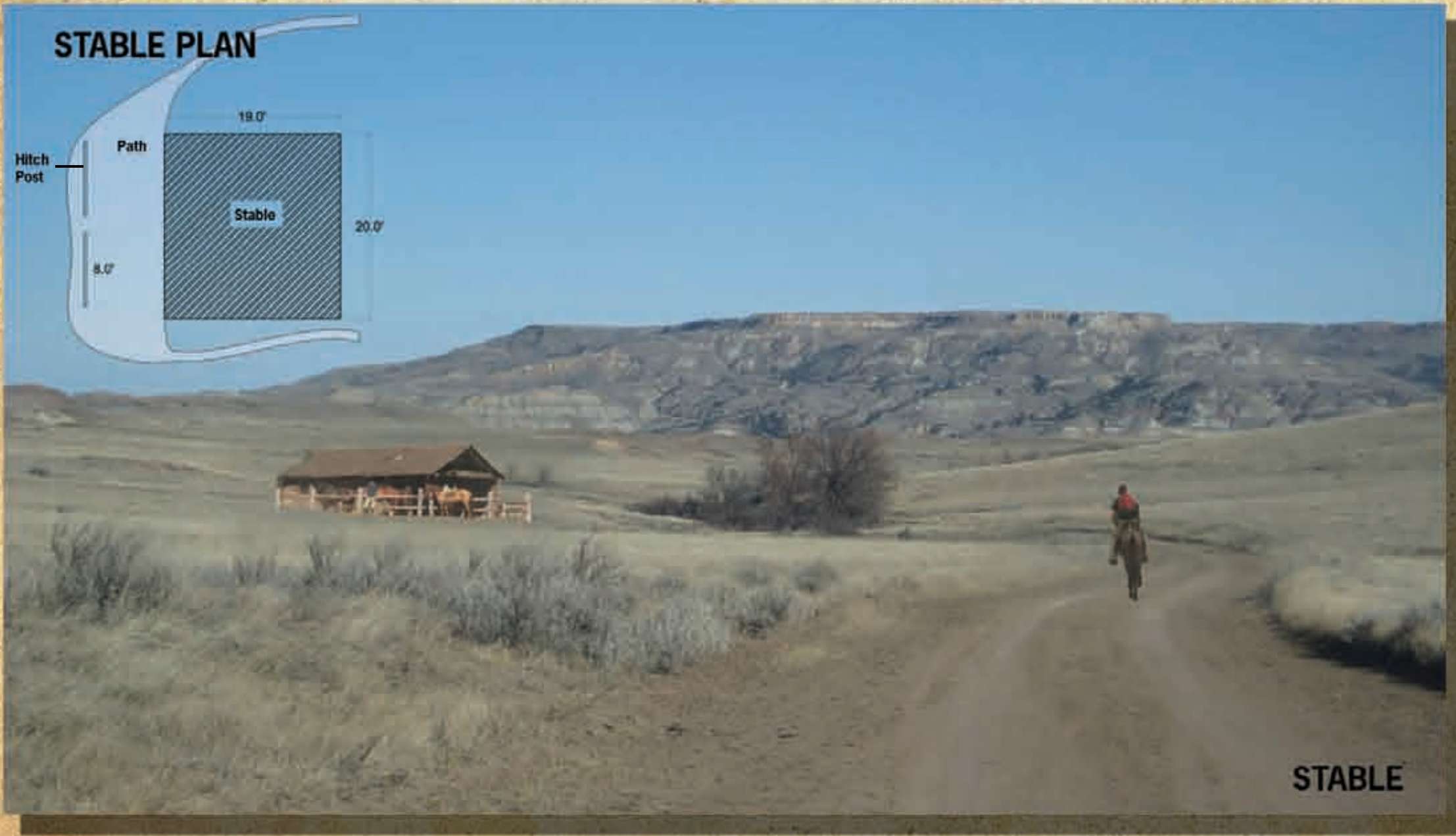
TYPICAL WALL ADVERTISEMENT DETAIL

All buildings will have an information center recommending and promoting the area and adjacent businesses around the building. Restrooms will also be available. 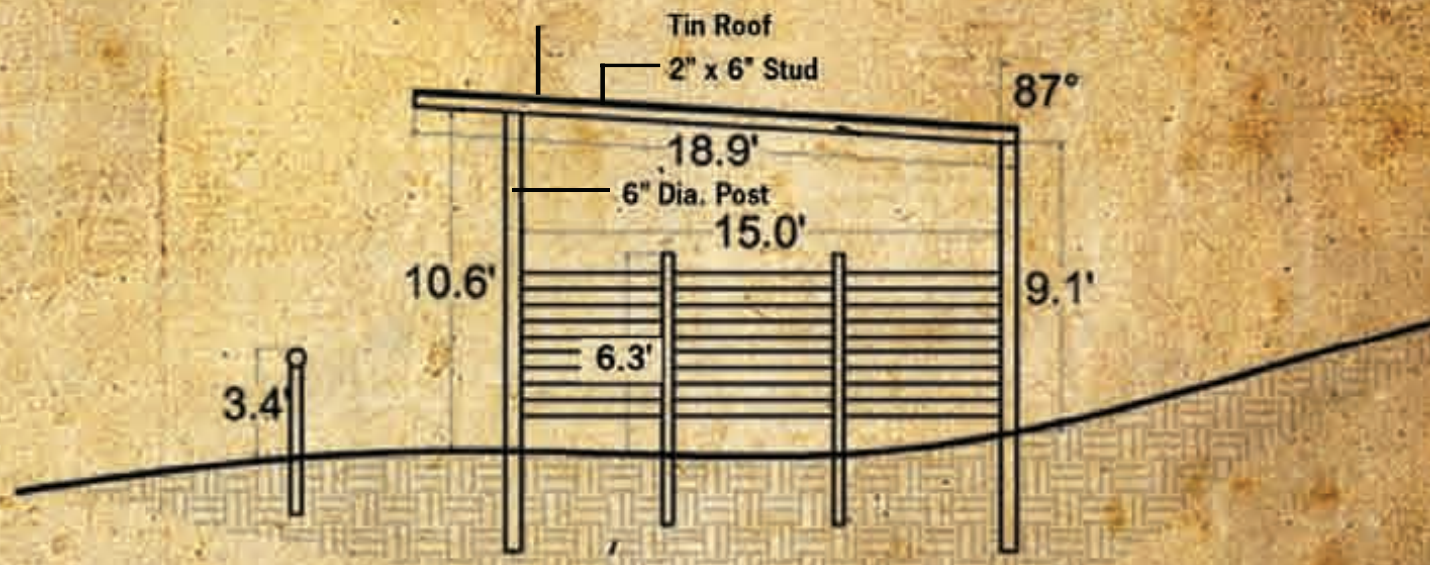


1 PROPOSED KIOSK CENTER SECTION

The last design idea is a stable and a horse trail in the Red Hills looking up at Bullion Butte. A five mile scenic trail with no signs of the recent world will bring people to the past. The relaxing trail ride will bring the perfect opportunities to see wildlife like coyotes, big-horned sheep, pheasants, and deer.

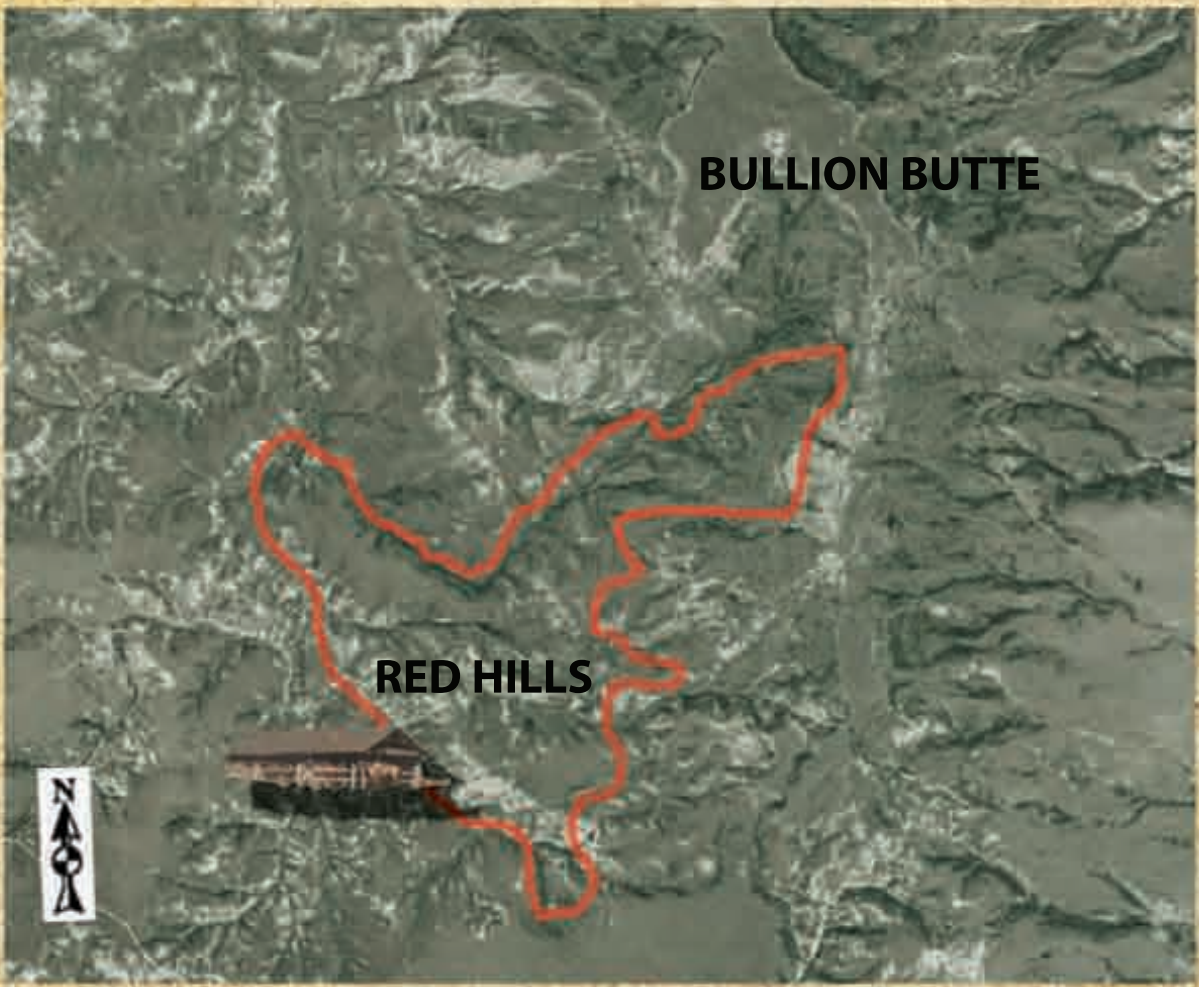


TYPICAL STABLE SECTION

The stable will be an old western pole stable that will serve for the needs of the horses and owner. The stable will be able to hold approximately eight horses.



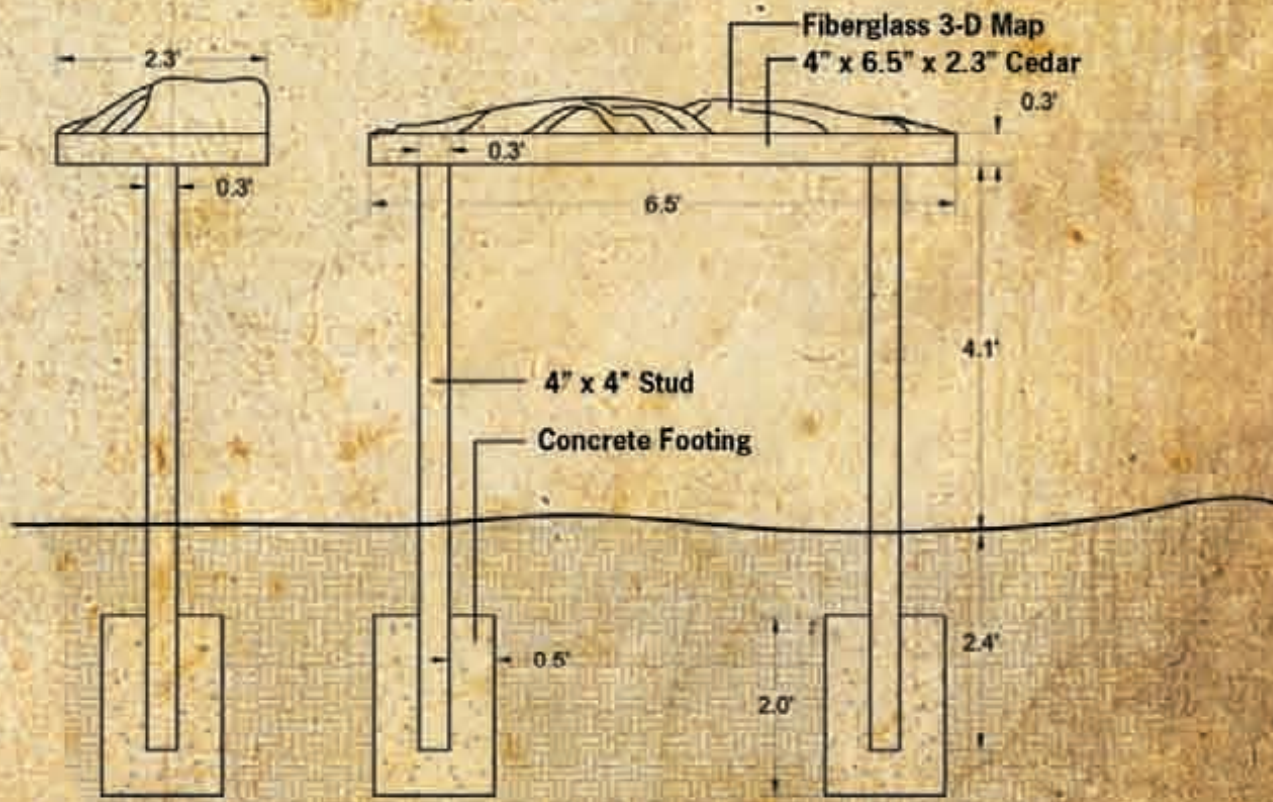

The new signs will fit its Beach's atmosphere. They will be made of stained cedar. The top will be an accurate 3-D view of the area and the trails or sites surrounding.



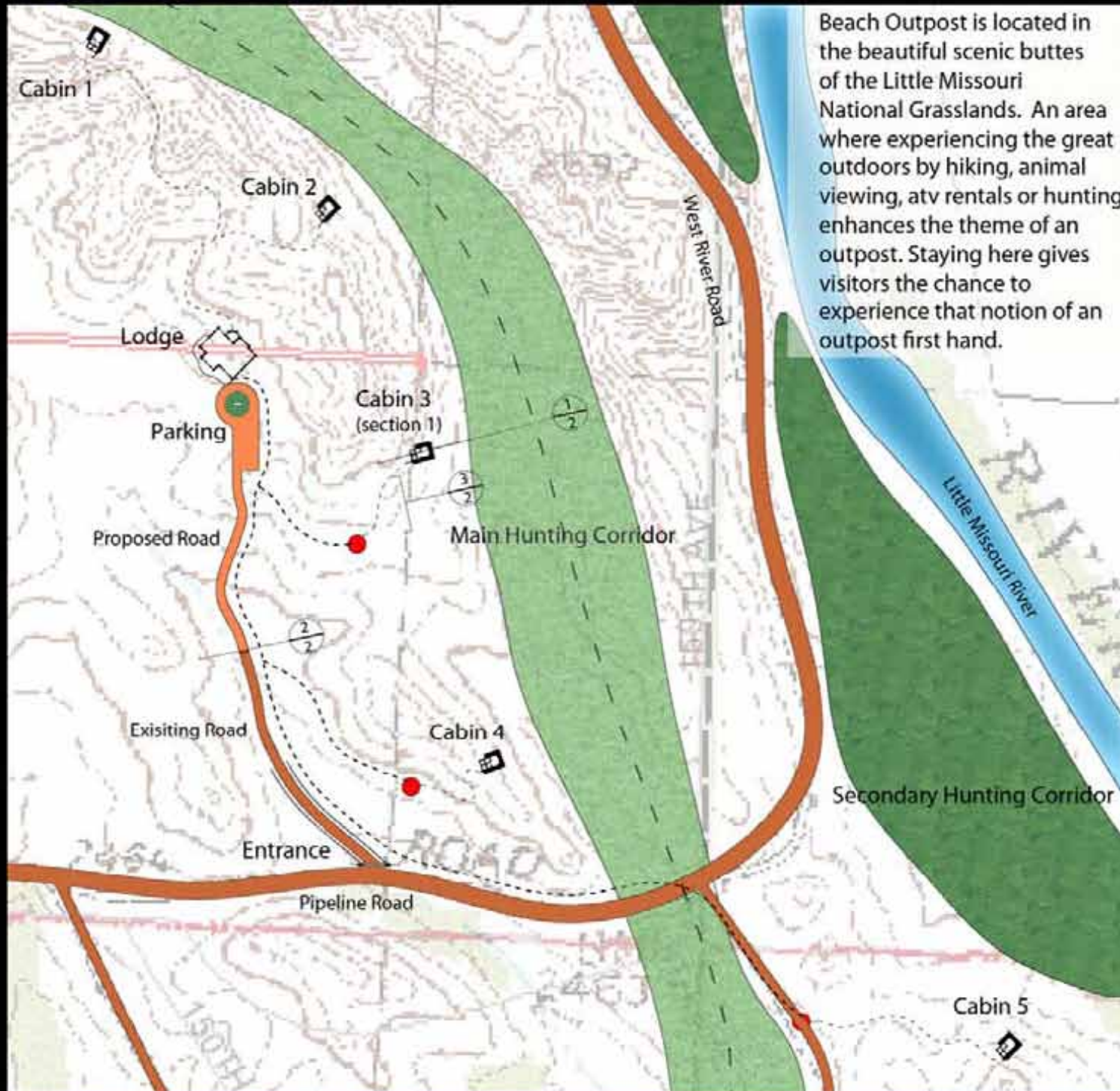
TRAIL PLAN

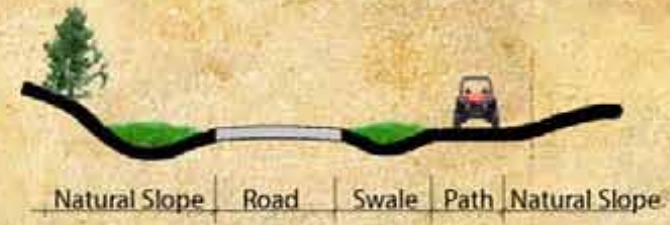

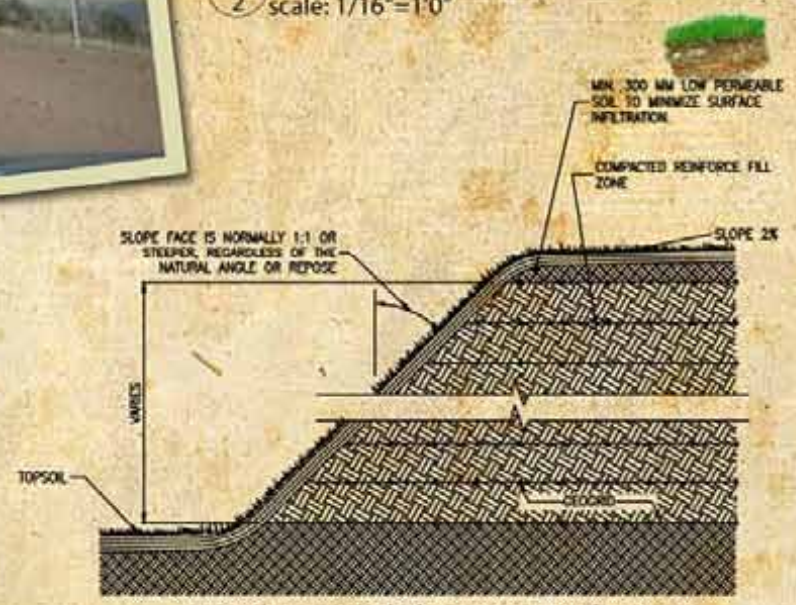

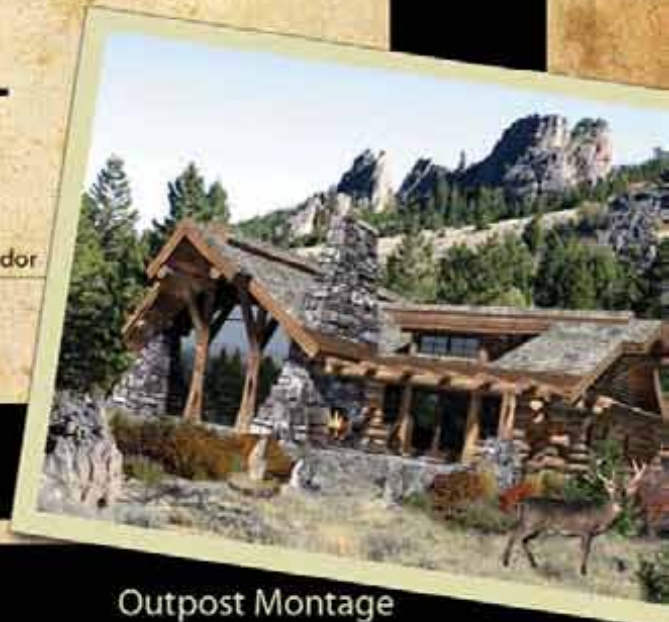

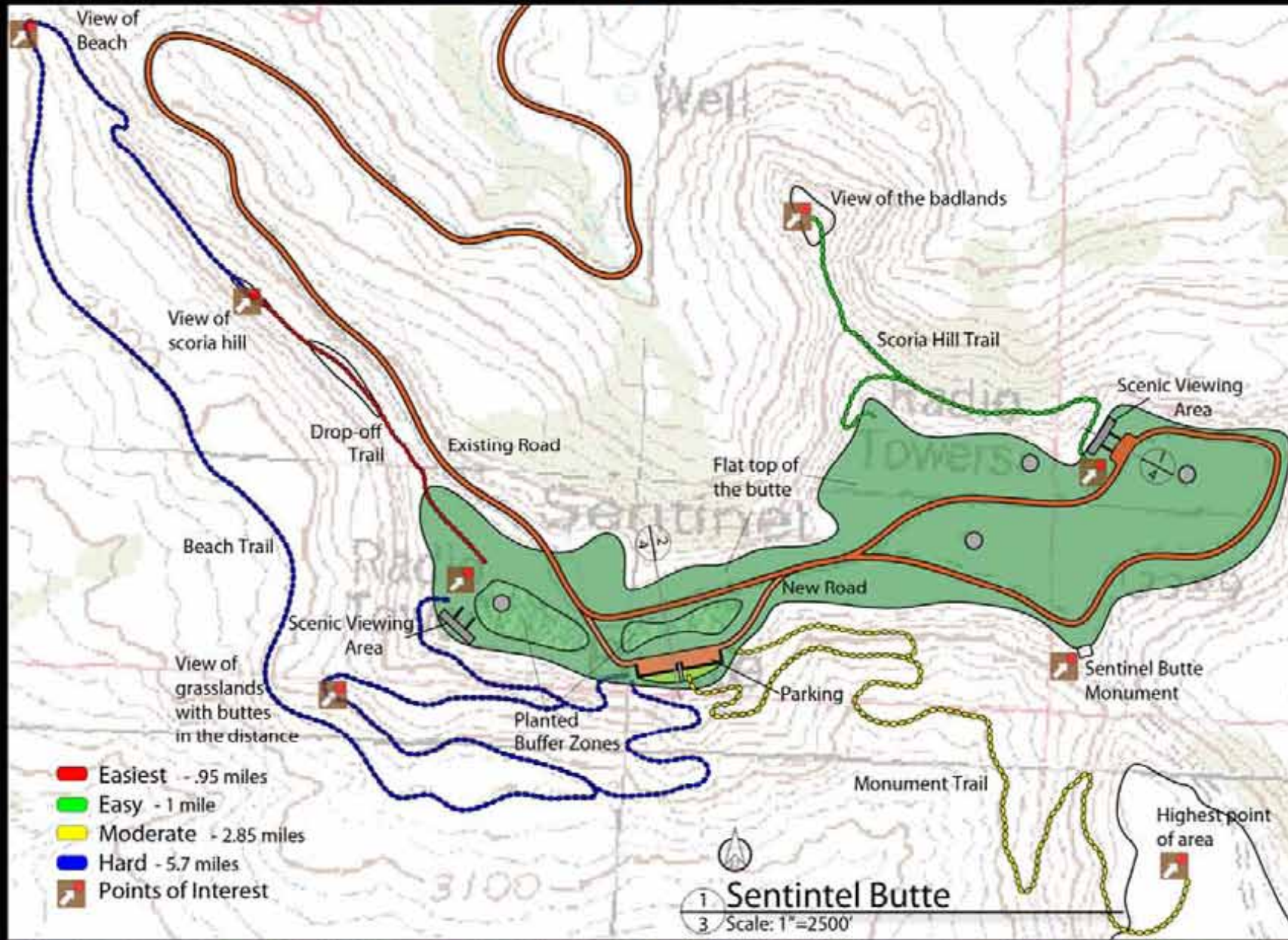

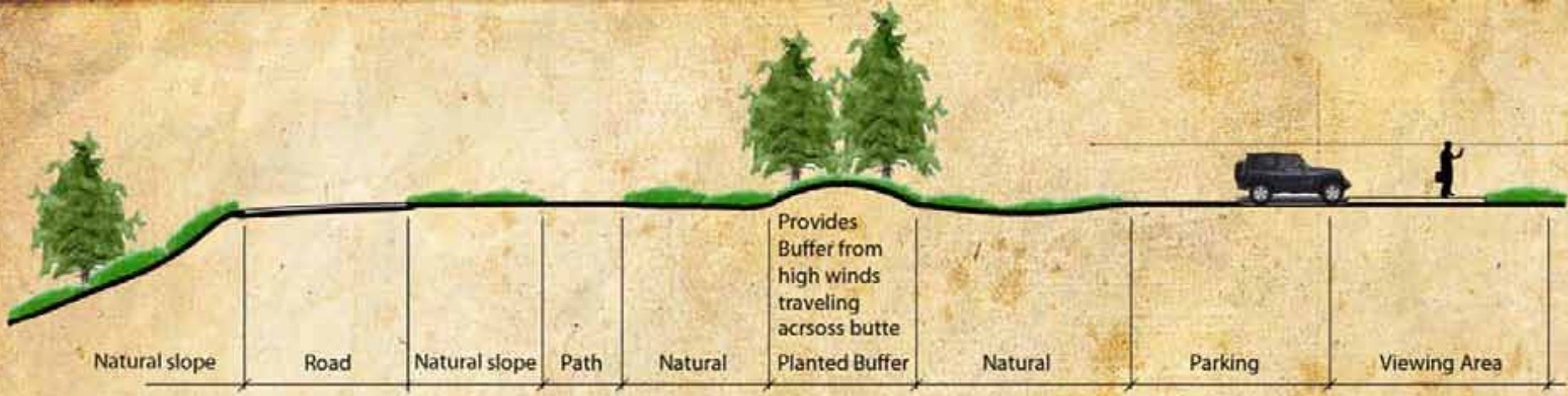


Visitors will have the chance to get off the beaten path to explore the more peaceful corners of the valley and beyond.

Hiking trails are for various ages and abilities.



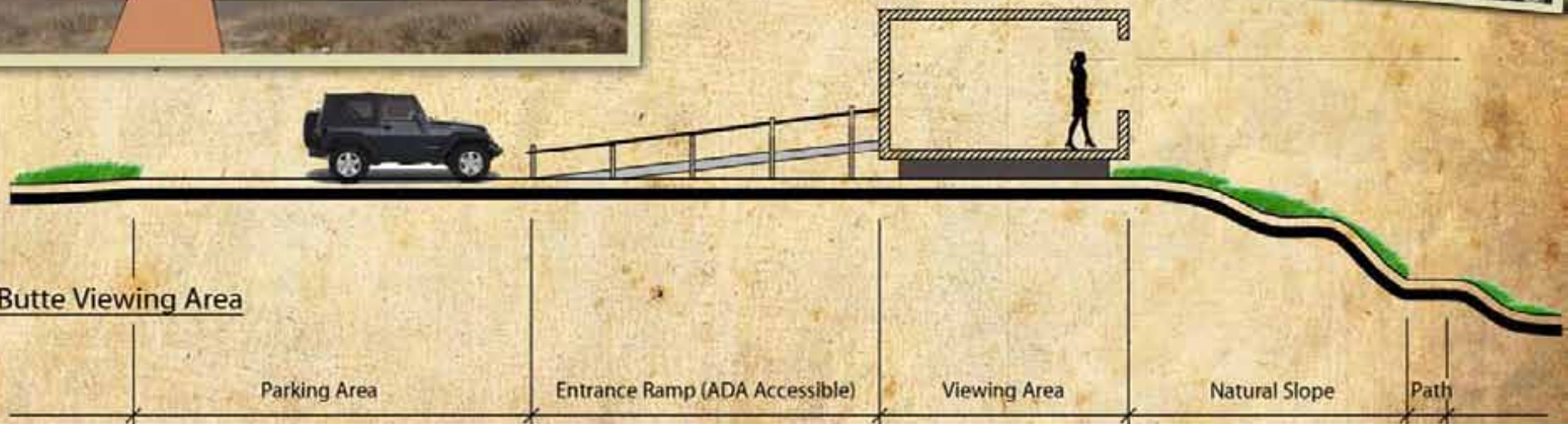


2 Sentinel Butte Road and Parking Section

Proposed Viewing Area

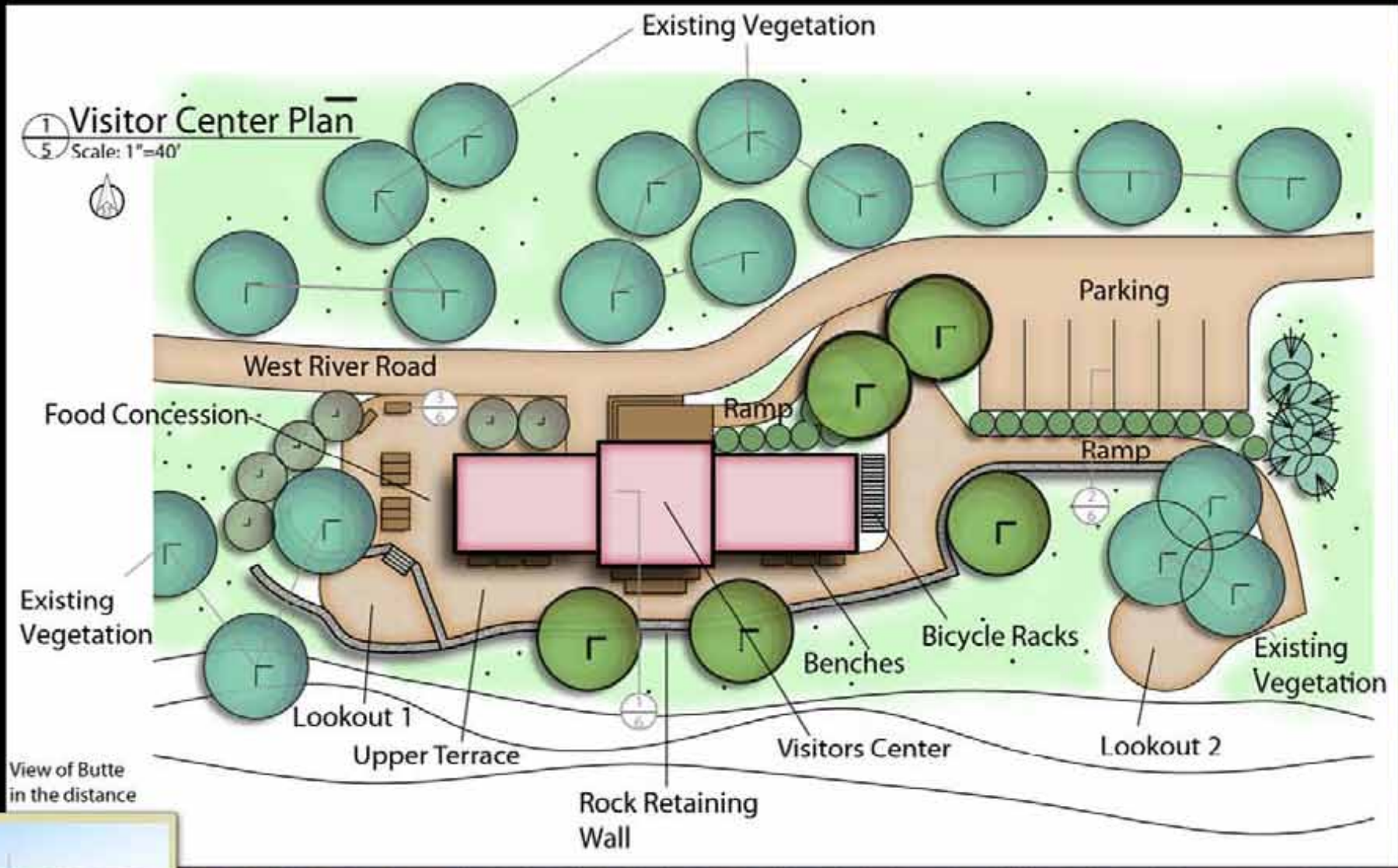
Proposed Hiking Path

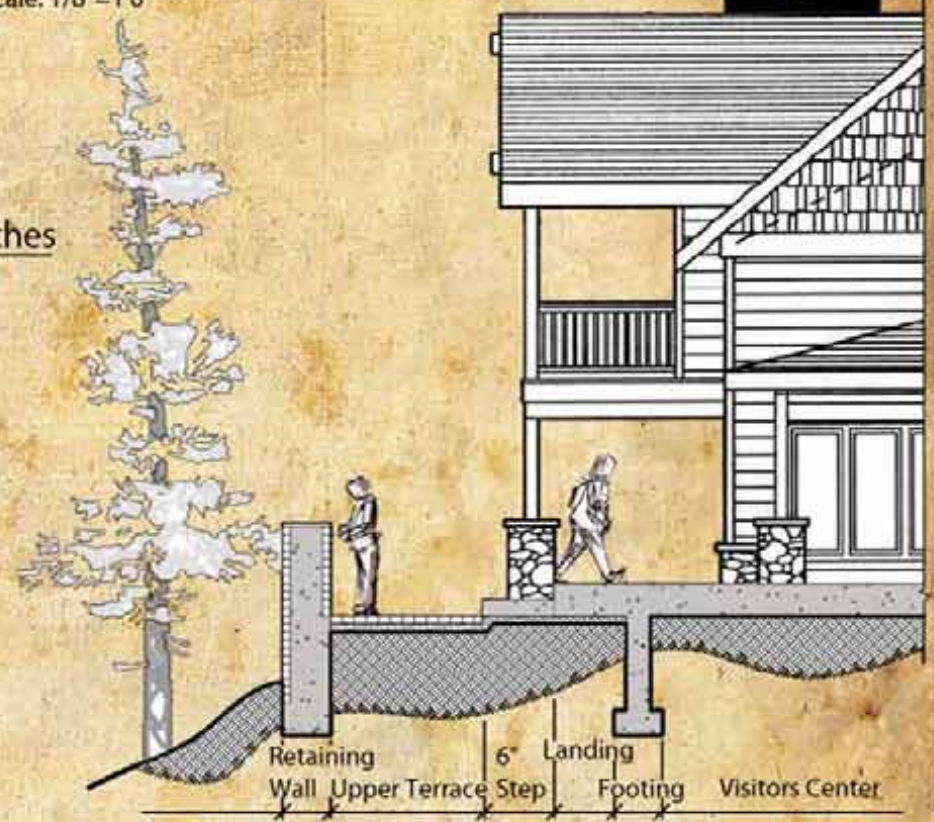
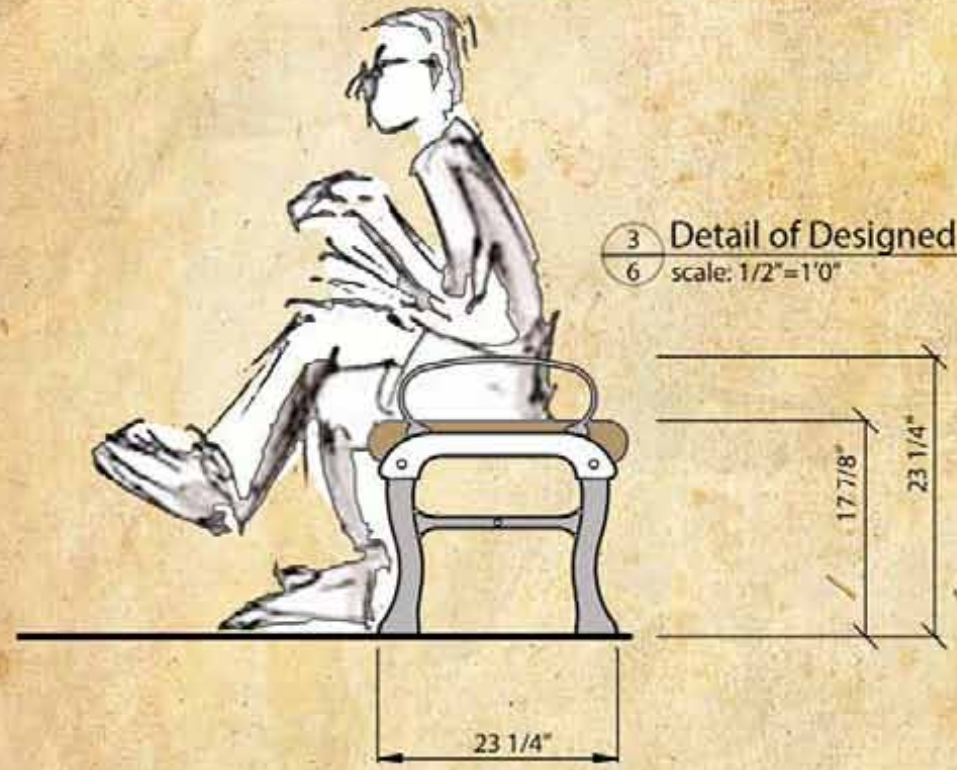

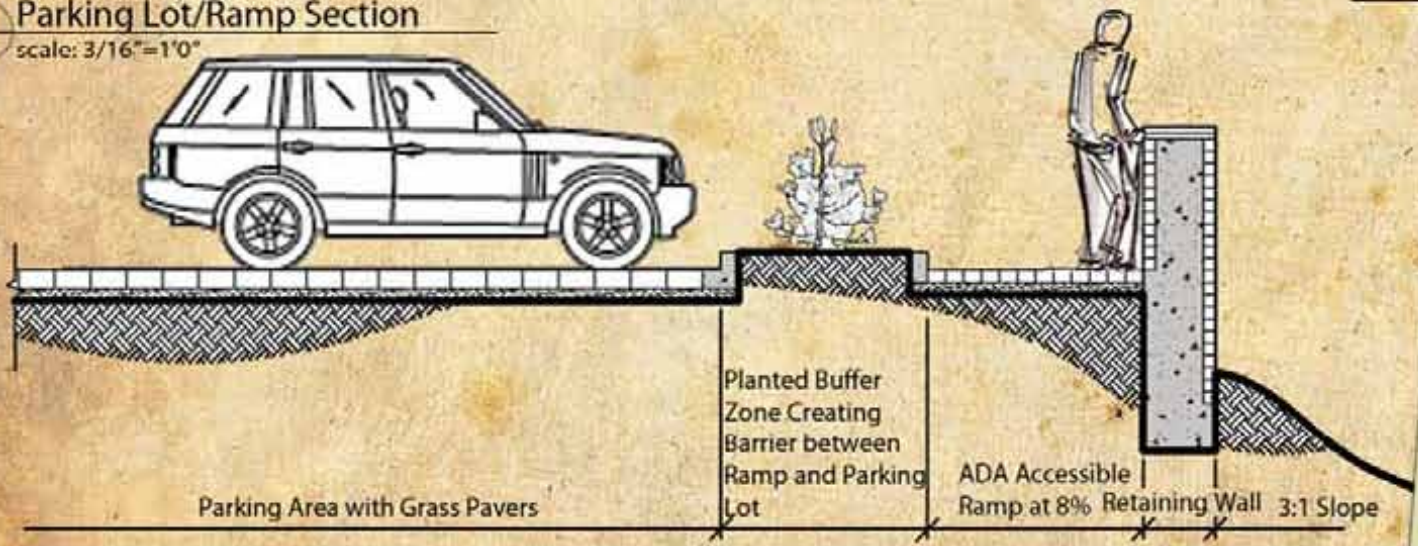


1 Viewing Area and Parking Section
