

THEODORE ROOSEVELT NATIONAL PARK

STEP 1: MALTESE CABIN



Built during the winter of 1883-84, the Maltese Cross Cabin was Theodore Roosevelt's first home in Dakota Territory. The cabin is located near the parks visitor center and is open year around.

STEP 2: T. ROOSEVELT NATIONAL PARK



What says wild west better than the great american bision itself? these majestic animals are readily spotted throughout the park. They are quite the sight to see.

STEP 3: MORE SITES TO SEE AT T.R. PARK



Feral horses are a unique sight. These horses run wild in the park and surrounding grasslands. the horses are rounded up every few years and some are adopted. This keeps their numbers down and the herd healthy.

STEP 4; GRASSLANDS OUTSIDE OF THE PARK



Big horn sheep are found in the area. Other animals you may find include: Elk, cayotes, eagles, bears and if you are lucky you may see a mountain lion.

STEP 5: ANNEAR SCHOOL



This old school house is located near the missouri opposite of the elkhorn ranch. the drive to the school is very beautiful. it's worth the trip. If you turn right on the road just south of the school it'll take you to a ford in the river. This ford may not be crossable at all times. there is a better ford crossing about 3/4 a mile to the south of this one.
