Course Goal: To assist you in having a successful freshman year experience.

Course Objectives:

• To provide an introduction to the skills necessary for academic success;

- To identify for students the resources for intellectual, personal and social growth available to them as members of the University community;
- To examine the relationship of an Arts & Sciences education to the world of work;
- To explain the philosophy, purpose, and value of general education;
- To introduce students to the purposes of higher education, to the role of the faculty, and to their responsibilities as students;
- To provide opportunities for increased student awareness of themselves and others; and
- To explain degree sheets and requirements, curriculum planning, and the enrollment process.

Blackboard:

You will be required to log on to Blackboard (http://blackboard.okstate.edu) regularly to access course materials. It is expected that you know how to use this feature because a large percent of your grade will come from assignments posted on blackboard.

Written Work:

Writing is an important skill that will be integral to your success in college. All papers should be typed (10-12 point font, 1" margins, double-spaced) and well written. You will find a first draft is rarely acceptable in any of your courses.

Attendance and Participation:

Ten points are earned (or lost) each day. Attendance and participation are necessary to earn the 10 points. NOTE: These points could be lost by, but not limited to, sleeping in class, reading or working on other course materials, reading a newspaper or other materials or creating a disturbance in class (e.g. cell phone use of any kind). Please note that "excused" absences and make-up assignments are at the discretion of the instructor. Documentation of a medical problem or other extenuating circumstance is required. Requests for excused absences should be made in advance if possible, but by all means as soon as possible after your return to class.

Cell Phones and Other Disruptions:

Make sure that your cell phone is turned off before entering the classroom. Students will lose points for ringing cell phones, text messaging, playing games, or any other avoidable incidents that cause a disruption to the class.
